

When Marian Sang Lyrics RACER

“When Marian Sang” by Pam Rian contains song lyrics that Marian Anderson once sang and that help back up the information in the book. Some examples of that in the text are the songs “Were you there when they laid him in the tomb.” and “Sometimes I feel like a motherless child.” The passage contains these song lyrics which support what kind of emotions Marian is feeling at the time. The author includes many examples of songs supporting Marian’s feelings.

Marian Anderson sang songs that were relevant with her emotions at the time. For example, when she was happy she sang happy songs and when she was sad her songs weren’t as upbeat. The song “were you there when they laid him in the tomb?” is a good example because the reason she sang this song is because of her feelings. This is another piece of text evidence that backs up the fact that Marian Anderson songs help explain and backup her feelings in the text.
